Path by river Dulnain Should be in Core Paths Plan
Community Newsletter CNPA award on 18th May. Our newsletter was second. Vote of thanks for Carol's hard work
Reed Court Dog fouling: **SBlack** has been in touch with 'dog' wardens; they now do pest work only as too much work scheduled
Mannfield Place trees DR reported that Forestry Commission have taken over responsibility for permissions to take trees down. Or Highland Council. Dennis Torley or Robert Paton

Future Highland Council

4 Councillors: **SBlack** and Dave Fallows on Inverness, Nairn and Badenoch & Strathspey Planning Committee
SBlack reported that he will regularly be attending our meetings, but others can be asked to attend. May be appropriate if a particular concern is under a Committee which is attended by two of the other 4.
Discretionary Budget now altered. All Wards will get the same despite the Common Good Funds which benefit Inverness and Nairn. Full Council meeting on it was today 31 May. If we want to know how B & S Councillors and other Independents voted we should contact the Chief Executive's office. 29 votes from Lib Dem and Labour

Carr Road Development

JA expressed concern about the lack of consensus over the exact wording of the letters to CNPA about our concerns. SB felt that always will be divergence of opinion but most issues had been resolved and KA pointed out that we were only trying to reflect the views of other villagers to whom we had spoken and were not expressing our own views.

Duck Race

New ducks require numbering. KA to try to get tickets for next meeting

Deer Management

FMcM attended meeting at Kinveachy organised by Seafield Estate with 22 people present., and KA went on tour of estate Estate are aiming for 3 deer / km², with necessary culling to obtain this. Funding of £440,000 over 10 years with agreement of SNH and Deer Commission. Reason is the Designations of Natura 2000, SAC and SPA and preservation of natural indigenous trees and vegetation. There is no deer fencing on Seafield to prevent deer migration, but Clune and Kinrara are going to put up fences to keep their deer in. Redundancies also concerned these two Estates. No explanations of future expected income streams as will lose stalking revenue
